AFRICAN SUMMIT URGED

Ghanaian Also Asks Action on French Atom Tests

ADDIS ABABA, Ethiopia,
June 16—Foreign Minister Ako
Adjei of Ghana called today for
an African summit meeting in a
speech to a conference of inde-
pendent African states here.

Africa cannot remain uncon-
cerned and silent while the Big
Powers "gamble humankind's
fate on the chessboard of inter-
national politics," he said. He
called for positive action against
French atomic tests in the Sa-
hara and urged a collective cam-
paign, including a boycott,
against South Africa's racial
policies.

Mr. Adjei also renewed
Ghana's support for a union of
African states and called for the
establishment of an African
council for economic cooperation
to help prevent the foreign dom-
ination and Balkanization of
Africa.
